In order for a child to receive a forensic interview and medical exam personnel from Law Enforcement and/or the Department of Social Services (DSS) must make the referral. If you believe your child has been abused, please contact Law Enforcement and/ or the Department of Social Services in your area. Therapy services are also offered at TEDI BEAR to children and their non-offending caregivers. A referral from Law Enforcement or DSS is not required for therapy services.

Non-offending caregivers are expected to participate in therapy since they are the most important and powerful people in their children's lives. Community members such as teachers, doctors, therapists, or caretakers may contact the TEDI BEAR Center to make a referral for therapy. If needed, the therapists may make recommendations for other appropriate mental health resources. Please note that if there is an active investigation into abuse allegations, therapy services will typically begin after a forensic

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interview and/or medical exam has been completed. Therapy services are provided at no cost to families, although identified insurance providers will be billed.
